What is it and why is it important?



Media Literacy

the ability to <u>critically</u> analyze stories presented in the mass media and to determine their accuracy or <u>credibility</u>.



What does media literacy look like in practice?

- Applying critical inquiry: question everything you see, read and hear. What's the source? What's the POV? What's the message?
- Consuming media from diverse points of view
- Seeking primary sources when possible; watch that town meeting yourself and draw your own conclusions; trace quotes, claims, or secondary media to the original source
- Recognizing stereotypes, propaganda, and mis/disinformation for what they are stay vigilant

Lee and Tuberville Introduce Bill to Abolish the TSA

March 27, 2025

Bill would privatize airport security under federal oversight

WASHINGTON – Senator Mike Lee (R-UT) and Senator Tommy Tuberville (R-AL) today introduced the Abolish the TSA Act, which would dissolve the bloated and ineffective Transportation Security Administration while allowing America's airports to compete to provide the safest, most efficient, and least intrusive security measures, under a new Office of Aviation Security Oversight.

"The TSA has not only intruded into the privacy and personal space of most Americans, it has also repeatedly failed tests to find weapons and explosives," said Sen. Lee. "Our bill privatizes security functions at American airports under the eye of an Office of Aviation Security Oversight, bringing this bureaucratic behemoth to a welcome end. American families can travel safely without feeling the hands of an army of federal employees."

"The TSA is an inefficient, bureaucratic mess that infringes on Americans' freedoms," said Sen. Tuberville. "It's a bloated agency-riddled with waste, fraud, and abuse of taxpayer dollars—that has led to unnecessary delays, invasive pat downs and bag checks, and frustration for travelers. We need to focus on more efficient and effective methods to protect our country without sacrificing the liberties and freedoms of American citizens. The TSA should be eliminated and replaced with privatized solutions that are more targeted, streamlined, and where appropriate, accountable to limited government oversight."




A little about Ground News

Lateral reading: a strategy that encourages readers to leave the news source they are reading to see what other digital sources say [about either the topic or the outlet itself - factuality, bias, etc.

- Knowing the bias of a media outlet can help understand how and why a story is being framed a certain way; factuality ratings provide insight into the reporting practices of the publication.

Not all sources report on stories equally.

The Bias Bar puts news coverage in context, making it easy to spot media narratives and get a birds-eye-view of how sources are reporting on a story from across the political spectrum.






The distribution chart shows you all the sources reporting on the story and where they fall on the political spectrum.

Compare and contrast different perspectives by clicking the source icons to read their coverage of the issue.

*While these are large, mostly national news sites, the same critical media literacy practices used when consuming national content can be easily applied to smaller local outlets and social media. Don't passively consume news and take all claims at face value. The more you practice *active* consumption of information (through questioning sources and thinking critically), the better!



See Polarization in Action




